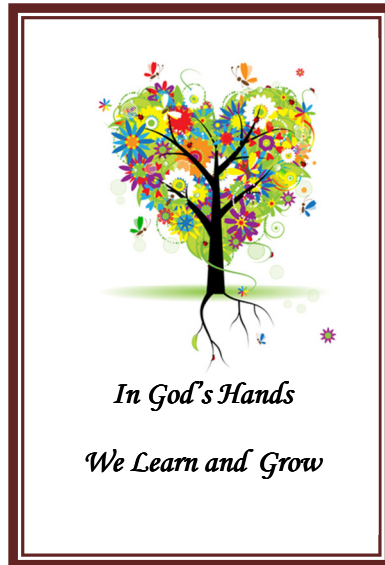

Our School Values

As a Church school with a strong Christian ethos we are committed to doing the best for all of the children in our care, making everyone feel included and valued. We have worked with members of our community to choose 6 Christian based values that will help guide us to be the best we can be in our everyday lives.



These values will form the foundation of our choices as adults and we will take the time to learn

more about what they mean and question what they might look like in our community and beyond, making sure this is understood by and relevant to the lives of the children.

We have used a 'values tree' to help children relate to the idea and have the most beautiful display in the centre of the school that the talented Mrs Bowhill has created with help from the children. Please come in and admire it if you can.

Our value for this half-term is Love

Right next door you will see the 'Bee Rules' which the children have helped us update and remind us what it might look like if we use our values in our school day. We will be praising 2 children from each class who have shown us they are following the rules in our weekly 'Busy Bee' assembly. Look out for the sticker that will show you your child has been a 'Busy Bee' that week and feel free to pop-in and find their 'Bee' on the board that will explain why they were chosen. We are attaching a copy of our 'Bee Rules' to this newsletter for your information and it would be great if you could talk about them at home.

Swimming Pool

It was with great disappointment to us all that we had to close the swimming pool early this year, our apologies for any inconvenience this may have caused. Unfortunately this was unavoidable; a surveyor has advised us that the walls are not safe and we have therefore taken the precaution of fencing off the

surrounding area until we have a long-term plan in place. The pool is a great asset to the community, so we will quickly work to get it back up and running. (I think I sense a major fund-raising initiative!)

Top of the School

One of the benefits of being an infant school is that the older children (Year 2) at Newdigate have always been given opportunities to lead and help the younger children at an early age, and we are continuing to give this high priority. We are working to give them opportunities to serve the community by taking on roles such as 'Play Leaders', 'Office Angels' and 'Buddies' to a child who has just joined us, not just at lunch but at other times in the day when they can 'teach' their Buddy such as 'Library Time' and PE. They will of course rise to the occasion so we will keep you informed.

Finally, there are often times in our afternoon learning when having a set play gets in the way of children's learning and we wanted to make sure that if children were fully immersed in their learning they could keep the momentum going! We are therefore trying a 'flexible' timing for the afternoon only, so far staff and children love it!
