PE and Sport Premium 2015-2016

A Sport Premium is paid directly to primary schools from Central Government.

2015-16 is the third year that this has been the case and schools are now seeing the benefit of the cumulative effect of sustained investment.

Newdigate Infant School will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per Key Stage 1 pupil per annum:

The funding is ring-fenced: it may only be spent on PE and Sport, specifically: "... to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport ... to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles."
