

# Newdigate Infant School

## Sports Premium Funding Academic Year 2014/15

### Background Information:

The government is providing substantial additional primary school sports funding for the academic years 2013/4 and 2014/5 to improve the provision and quality of physical education and sport in primary schools as part of the Olympic legacy. All state maintained schools which have primary aged children will receive £8000 plus £5 per pupil (excluding reception) for each of the two academic years. Funding is calculated per pupil according to the annual census in January. The funding is ring fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Schools will have the freedom to be able to choose how they do this.

We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupil progress and participation in PE and school sport and will be surveyed by OFSTED at the end of the first year. We are required to publish online information on our website about how we have used the funding, including details about our sporting provision and our school's sports vision.

### Our Vision Statement:

Physical education develops the children's knowledge, skills and understanding, so that they can perform with increasing competence and confidence in a range of physical activities. We believe physical activity ensures physical, mental and emotional well-being, and promotes positive attitudes towards a healthy lifestyle. We hope that our children will continue to make informed choices about physical activity throughout their lives and to take part in sports, which they enjoy, sustaining into a lifelong participation of regular exercise.

### Summary of Spending and Actions Taken:

Following our audit of PE provision, we identified the need for continued staff training to confidently deliver games, gym and dance; to improve and update our PE scheme; to maintain provision of swimming throughout the school in the summer months; to provide more outdoor resources for the Early Years and to increase resources for our active lunchtimes. With some of the funding the Primary and Infant schools have employed a School Sports Coordinator for 2 days a week for schools to work collaboratively on shared priorities to develop a sustainable long term structure.
