Dear Parents,

As we end out first half-term of the year we have a lot to celebrate. Today we visited the church for our Harvest celebration. This year our theme was **'Sowing the Seeds of Generosity'**. Watching the economic crisis unfold before us, we felt compelled to use this as an opportunity to think



about how lucky and thankful we are for the food we have and be ready to show our generosity by sharing what we have with those in need. You have already shown great generosity by donating food that has been taken to Crawley Open House by Ian Wilkins. We were thrilled to have him join us for our service today and learn more about the work they do.

Talking of generosity, we collected a lot of bottles yesterday and had a very comfy PJ day! Thank you. They will be stored safely, ready for our Christmas fayre.

In the last few weeks we have been foscussing in on activities that will support children's **personal development and well-being**, helping them to better understand how to keep themselves safe and healthy.



Last Monday, we raised awareness of looking after our physical and mental well-being by participating

in Young Minds 'Hello Yellow Day'. We looked at the five ways to improve our well-being. The day started with an assembly where we were all active together and participated in a morning workout. We then took notice of our surrounding with Mrs Denyssen and did some meditation. In our classrooms we connected and made paper chains of the people we connect to when we are feeling low. We also thought about what we could give to other people to improve their well-being. Finally, we all tried something new in the afternoon ranging from baking to pampering ourselves making bath bombs, painting to music and getting muddy in the woods! A great day was had by all and we most definitely felt brighter when we ended the day!

Last Wednesday we help our NSPCC **'Stay Safe, Speak Out**' assembly. The whole school watched the on-line presentation that outlined the many ways children could stay safe and look after themselves if they were experiencing problems. Children also learnt how to talk to trusted adults and were introduced to Childline. This briefly introduced the 'privates stay private' rule. 
#### Attendance.
