Lockdown Procedures.

After watching the unfortunate stabbing events unfold a few weeks ago in a Welsh school, it seems appropriate to use this space to inform parents about our approach to any danger inside our school.

We still refer to this as our 'Lockdown Procedure', and although the term lockdown has become something very different post-pandemic, we will continue to use that language. As an infant school, we have made the decision to NOT undergo practices for a lockdown as we do not want to unduly frighten children. We have undergone desktop exercises so that we know exactly what to do should we need to lockdown due to an internal danger. Our full policy is available on the website in the safeguarding section, but I wanted to raise your awareness to the statement that relates to parents:

'Pupils will not be released to parents during a lockdown.

Communication between parents and the school

Arrangements for communicating with parents in the event of a lockdown, should be routinely shared either via newsletter or the school website.

In the event of an actual lockdown, it is strongly advised that any incident or development is communicated to parents as soon as is practicable. It is obvious that parents will be concerned but regular communication of accurate information will help to alleviate undue anxiety.

Any incident or development will be communicated to parents as soon as is practicable via **Parentmail.**Our lockdown message is:

'The school is in a full/ partial lockdown situation; we are doing all we can to keep your child safe. During this period the switchboard and entrances will be unmanned, external doors locked and nobody is allowed in or out. We will endeavour to keep you informed. Please await further instructions and do not attempt to come to the school site until you have been informed to do so. You do not need to contact the school. Calling the school could tie up telephone lines that are required for contacting emergency support providers.'

Should parents be present at the school during a lockdown under no circumstances should members of staff leave the building to communicate directly with them.'

Whilst we hope we never have to send this message, we thought it would be good for you to know about it.
