During the Autumn term, up to Christmas, the children will be learning the following skills:

Maths	Literacy
We will be enjoying developing our maths skills by providing practical apportunities both in the inside and outside classroom through a playing maths games, shape hunts, building models, experimenting with capacity and weight.  • Subitise within 3 (perceptual subitising) and develop	The children will shortly be commencing with wordless books before reading books with words. We will be enjoying a rich array of books, re-telling and re-enacting familiar stories.  • Create a rhyming string of 3 words
<ul> <li>subitising skills within 5 by noticing groups of numbers (conceptual subitising) and familiar patterns of numbers e.g. dice patterns.</li> <li>Explore composition of numbers within 5.</li> <li>Make comparisons using the language of more, less and equal.</li> <li>Develop 1:1 counting skills and understanding of 'how many' (cardinality) within 10.</li> <li>Count verbally to 20 and beyond.</li> <li>Naming common 2D shapes: triangle, square, rectangle, circle.</li> <li>Describing 2D shapes: sides, corners.</li> <li>Comparing length and weight using mathematical vocabulary.</li> <li>Creating and describe repeating patterns.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Say the initial sound of a word - "c for cat"</li> <li>Segment the three sounds in a three letter word (spell 3 letter words)</li> <li>Listen to stories</li> <li>Retell stories in their own words</li> <li>Sound out 3 letter words and then blend these sounds to say the word. (Read 3 letter words)</li> <li>Begin to recognise some high frequency and tricky words on sight e.g. 'mum', 'the'</li> <li>Write their own name, starting with a capital letter for the initial letter and the subsequent letters lower case</li> <li>Recognise and write the letter graphemes a-z</li> <li>Begin to learn some digraphs – 2 letters that make one sound.</li> </ul>

- Children will need to arrive by 8:50 at the classroom door. School finishes at 3:00. We are aware that some parents are picking up from other schools and require a prompt dismissal so we are happy to see these children out slightly early if necessary.
- Please remember to bring bookbags in each day.
- Your child's reading books and 'You Read to Me' books will be changed on Wednesdays.
- Home Learning books will be collected every other Tuesday. The Home Learning book will then be handed out on the Friday, allowing 12 days to complete the set work.
- Children do not need a pencil case in Reception.
- Our PE days will be a Wednesday and Friday. The children need to come to school in their PE kit on these days. Children should wear black or navy blue joggers/leggings or shorts and trainers (with Velcro) with either their Newdigate PE top or their polo and jumper.
- Please bring in a pair of wellington boots that can be left at school.
